[Cimarron Canyon State Park](#)

- **Status:** None.
- **Fire restrictions:** Campfires allowed in provided grills only. Cooking allowed in provided grills, pressurized liquid or gas stoves and charcoal grills or cookers. No smoking restrictions.
- **Water Levels:** Stable. Water releases from Eagle Nest Lake are up to 5.6 CFS but run off from tributary creeks has slowed some what so the water flows in the river are some what low, but pretty stable. Flows are still better below Clear Creek, near the 292-mile marker.
- **Fishing report:** Fishing is fair to good. Water release from Eagle Nest Lake is up to 5.6 CFS but run off from tributary creeks has slowed some what so the water flows in the river are some what low, but pretty stable. Flows are still better below the confluence of Clear Creek, near the 292-mile marker. Canyon was stocked by the Game and Fish on Wednesday the 8th. Fishing at Gravel Pits good with worms, corn and power bait. Fishing on the Cimarron River good with recommended flies being: Dry Flies: Stimulators and Adams Para's, or Nymphs: San Juan worms, #18 Brassie's and bead head nymphs for trout. Fishing pressure has been relatively light on weekdays and a little heavier on weekends.

- **Status:** Six Mile and Cieneguilla Creek day use areas not open.
- **Fire restrictions:** No campfires. Cooking allowed with pressurized liquid or gas stoves and charcoal grills or cookers. No smoking restrictions at this time.
- **Lake level:** Current lake elevation 8121.15, this is up from last week. Water storage is currently 45,952 acre-feet. Rising slightly, the runoff is done on all creeks, normal summer flows only. Water release into Cimarron River, 5.2 CFS or 10.31 acre ft/day.
- **Boat ramp status, boating conditions:** Boat ramp is in great condition with the lake still rising. At the courtesy dock, the south anchor cable was extended and the dock was moved in and new land anchors were set. GREAT WATER CONDITIONS EXIST.
- **Fishing report:** Fishing is fair from the bank and anchored boats using roe sacks, power bait and salmon eggs for perch, slow for trout with the same bait.
